# FROM THE MINISTER'S MAC: ASHER TO EASTER

As I write this, we are in the season after Epiphany, that short season of liturgical green sandwiched between the blue of Christmas and the Purple of Lent. While the length of this season changes, the purpose remains the same: Discipleship.



Then comes Ash Wednesday, on 2/26 this year, which signals our move into Lent, the season for deep reflection, self-assessment and discernment regarding our faith journey. And our faith should *not* be all about the destination, but more about the journey.

In this liturgical year, we began the season of Advent with our journey to Christmas. In the days after Christmas, we remembered Jesus, Mary and Joseph journeying to Egypt and back. We remembered the journey of the Magi to see the Christ child, and their journey home. In the season after Epiphany, we each lived a bit deeper in to our own journey to see the Christ child, pondering how our paths have been changed and reshaped because of knowing Jesus.

Why then do we need Lent? Why have yet another season of discernment? Why bother with these seasons at all? Can't we live our lives each day and simply bookend those days with the celebrations of Christmas and Easter? The answer is, yes, of course, we can. Many do! Liturgical seasons and colors are considered old fashioned and irrelevant in today's world and in many churches. Those practices are too closely linked with the Catholic Church and its formality for many of our Protestant brothers and sisters. Some Churches dispensed with them in the early years of the Reformation, but brought them back in a rebirth of Christian ritual.

In the United Methodist Church, each local church may decide for itself what colors to use, or to use no colors or calendar at all. Some begin the season of Advent in mid-November for a greater season of focus and preparation for the coming of the Christ child. Some dispense with Holy Week altogether and go straight from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday with no mention of the Last Supper or the Crucifixion. Good Shepherd has changed its Lenten and Holy Week practices with its pastors, sometimes having a Good Friday service, sometimes choosing to focus only on Maundy Thursday, and sometimes combining both of those days in one service. This is not right or wrong, but simply a matter of preference.

Like the calendar and the colors, it is up to us as individuals to determine how we order our days. What will be our focus in these weeks following Ash Wednesday? How well will we apply our own discerning eye to the lives we lead? For me, the calendar, the colors, even preaching from the lectionary Scriptures each week, are a choice I make to help me remember to wrestle with things I might rather leave alone, to help me do the work discipleship requires, and to remind me, every time I see the red paraments gracing our church all summer long, that God's Holy Spirit blows where it will and cannot be controlled by calendars or colors or any other device of humanity. Praise God!

I pray you have a blessed and meaningful Lenten season. If you want to plug in a little more deeply to worship and celebration as we journey from ashes to Easter, check the Lenten Schedule in this newsletter — and I'll see you in church!


#### **DIVERSITY WELCOMING TEAM MEETING**

# FEBRUARY 2020 ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD MEETING INFORMATION:

- Mike Swing from Magnus Premium coffee gave us a presentation on the possibility of partnering with his coffee company to offer a 25% refund for all coffee purchased through a unique URL. The coffee cups and bags are 100% recyclable. We agreed that the board would do research individually and then revisit this next meeting.
- Karen Bueno talked about a book she is reading called "Interfaith Leadership: A. Primer" by Eboo Patel. GSUMC's participation with the Denver American Indian Festival has helped improve Native American relationships and our knowledge has increased regarding these relationships.
- The Board reviewed the goal, objectives, and core values that were approved during the January retreat and we all signed the 2020 Leadership covenant.
- Roger Wise presented the weekly giving and budged percentage report. Don Robinson submitted the balance sheet and actual vs. budget through January 31, 2020.
- Rev. Lin explained some issues with staff pay and the need to comply with Colorado Labor laws. She has notified staff of the changes and will be working with Roger Wise and Don Robinson to make the necessary changes.
- Jim Green has received two quotes to replace the roof. He feels that we should be prepared to replace the roof around July of 2021. The approximate range we're talking about depending on what type shingles we use are between \$40,000 and \$100,000.00. More discussion to follow.
- Al Campbell met with UMW, UMM, and BASH on Saturday, February 15, to explore the possibility of forming a partnership with the Atlanta Bread Company regarding a new food ministry. More to follow on that soon.

The 2016 United Methodist General Conference changed the name to UMCOR Sunday to reflect the important work accomplished by the United Methodist Committee on Relief.


