FROM THE MINISTER'S MAC:

THE CONNECTIONAL CHURCH

If you go to www.UMC.org and look under the tab "Who We Are," you'll find several attributes listed that we like to think defines what it means to be United Methodist. The one attribute I've been thinking about quite a lot lately is "Connectional."

According to the UMC, being "Connectional" means: "Every United Methodist congregation is interconnected throughout the denomination via a unique, interlocking chain of conferences. The United Methodist Church practices representative democracy in its governance. Conferences elect delegates who are authorized to act and vote."

Yes, being connectional means our big system interconnects all the little systems so that we may govern ourselves, and we can leave it at that if we want to. But for me, being connectional is about human connection: Every United Methodist is interconnected with every other United Methodist throughout the denomination via the desire to uphold one another by our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. We belong to one another as the Body of Christ. We not only care about each other, we need each other, and I believe this is how God intends us to live.

So, when the Body becomes fractured and people begin leaving, it hurts all of us, there's no getting away from that. It is hard enough seeing people leave because work or family or medical issues require relocation, but when separation comes over differences of opinion, it hurts. We invest quite a lot in our church

relationships. Each of us shares so much with one another that we reach a deep level of friendship and love. Of course it hurts when someone says, "I love you and this is hard for me, but I want to be with people who believe what I believe."

Here's the hard part: We MUST continue to love. It is the toughest part of our faith and perhaps the one that challenges us the most. But it is the kind of love Christ gives us and calls us to give others. It is the kind of All-Means-All love that says, "Even if you don't want to be in community with me, I still want to be in community with you, so let's remain friends."

Tough love is a phrase we usually point at others when we are enforcing boundaries or accountability. Christ's tough love, on the other hand, calls us to look inward and knock down boundaries that prevent us from loving fully, and hold ourselves accountable for being loving even when we are facing what feel like unloving actions.

In this time of trial, when our Church is wrestling with its own demons, Christ's tough love is crucial. So let's continue to love. Let's continue to care. Let's continue to invest in our church relationships — not just within Good Shepherd, but also throughout our wrestling Church.



ADULT BIBLE STUDY CLASS Wednesday May 8th at 6:30 PM. 6 Week Study by Adam Hamilton



APRIL ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD MEETING RESULTS

A few of the items discussed are listed below. You are welcome to review the full meeting minutes which are in the binder in the office.

After seeking the advice of Brian Cheek, researching, and obtaining a discount on pricing we voted to approve the purchase of a new AED (automatic external defibrillator) for the church. The new AED will be in the Narthex for easy access (which hopefully we'll never need). We agreed to purchase the AED from the Edna Gallagher and Gary Lewis memorial funds. Both families have graciously allowed Good Shepherd to use the funds of their loved ones and we are grateful!

The Ad Board also agreed on four main goals for the next two years:

Retain and expand current congregation and make known that Good Shepherd UMC is an inclusive church.

Invite, welcome, and engage young families.

To remain financially stable.

To provide leadership training opportunities for the congregation.

We discussed Ministry team fundraising and the need for transparency, accountability, and organization of fundraising events. The Ministry teams will be provided a form to be submitted for fundraiser approval. Upon approval of the event, Julie Stirm will note the fundraiser on the church calendar in a different color, so that we can avoid having overlapping fundraisers. Outside fundraising, such as scouts, schools, etc. are not included on the calendar.

We received a proposal from Scott Varvir regarding the audio/visual equipment. Our current computer is several years old and is starting to experience freeze-ups and other problems. The software that is used for services also needs updating. We agreed to purchase a new computer, monitor, and updated software not to exceed \$2200.00. This money will come out of the general fund.

The items above are just a brief overview of our April meeting. Please check the minutes posted in the office for the rest.

We will not be meeting in May because of Mother's Day. Our next meeting is June 9th at 1pm. Please feel free to join us!
