FROM THE MINISTER'S MAC: THE VOTE

If you have been paying even a little bit of attention, you know that our Church — that is, the worldwide United Methodist Church — just voted on the subject of homosexuality. We held a Special General Conference where 862 delegates came from around the globe to find a way forward, once and for all, so that our Church would never again have to argue about human sexuality and its biblical context.



There were four plans presented by the Commission on A Way Forward:

THE SIMPLE PLAN — take the language out of our Book of Discipline (BOD) that reads, "homosexuality is not compatible with Christian teaching."

THE TRADITIONAL PLAN — keep the BOD as is and enforce it; also requiring "certification" from Conferences, bishops and clergy that we will adhere to the plan THE ONE CHURCH PLAN — let each church/pastor decide if it will accept gay/lesbian clergy and same sex weddings

CONNECTIONAL PLAN — Three conferences, to which any church, anywhere may belong: Traditional, Progressive, or Unity, each reflecting the local church's theology

These plans all require provisions for pensions, insurance, global ministries, and local churches leaving the denomination. So complicated. I can imagine God's eyes rolling back in the almighty head and a voice crying, "You have GOT to be kidding me."

And yet, a decision was reached. It was close, but in the end, the Traditional Plan passed with 53% of the vote and is now the stance of the United Methodist Church on homosexuality and homosexuals.

There are, however, questions as to the constitutionality of the Traditional Plan, so there may be legal maneuvering yet to endure. There are also decisions that clergy and conferences need to make, as those who feel they cannot adhere to the Traditional Plan have been invited to find a church home elsewhere.

For many, this is a life-altering day. The Church that has raised them, nurtured them, and even affirmed their call to ministry is now saying it doesn't want them. No room for differing opinions. No room for the cultural diversity that is evident around the globe. No room for understanding Scripture in various ways. No room for Wesley's "Think and let think." No room to be who God created and called them to be. So sad.

Even so, the future is not hopeless, for God is still with us. The sun rose in the east this morning. The world is still turning. We will still gather on Sunday to worship, sing songs of praise, and pray. Together. Praise God. And regardless of the rules of Churches, we can still be the light of Christ to a hurting world — in love.




Website Updates

DAIF has formed a partnership with the Westminster Rotary to help underprivileged children get computers. The program "COMPUTERS FOR KIDS" is underway and DAIF has been able to give three laptop computers away with the goal of giving 500 computers to children this year. Statistics tell us that only 40% of American Indian students graduate each year and it is because they do not have the basic tools, resources, or support to succeed. DAIF is thrilled to put a year around program together to help the community achieve that goal. WE NEED YOUR HELP, we need all the old computer systems that you are no longer using. The systems will be refurbished by Rotary and will be made available to DAIF. We need both laptop and desk top units. WE NEED YOUR HELP identifying students who need these and they do not need to be American Indian. Education of our children is the most worthwhile project that we can support for anyone. DAIF will be contacting the Homework Club first since they are a part of our church community.

DAIF will host the 9Health Fair during the Denver American Indian Festival this year. This amazing group will be there both days and will offer all of their standard health screening services. Those volunteers will also be able to council American Indians about their specific needs such as diabetes. Flu shots will be offered for a nominal fee as well.
