I believe our lives will be as happy as we are grateful.

November is the month of Thanksgiving. And in this month, I hope we can find the conditions of gratitude God has given us. I sincerely hope that November 2020 will be a happier November than previous years for everyone. - Rev. Yo Han

In an unusual year we need your help even more to give a local child a special Christmas

This is Good Shepherd's 17<sup>th</sup> year of donating gifts through the Thornton Police Department for children from newborn to 16 years old. Because of COVID-19 we have had to amend our usual approach.

There will be no tree with stockings and stars on it. We will not be able to store the gifts in the sanctuary as we have done in the past, so we are asking that gifts be brought to the church December 13<sup>th</sup> and a collection will take place after 1<sup>st</sup> and 2nd service (10 am and 11:30 am).

Because you will not have a stocking or star from the tree this year, just choose the age below and purchase appropriate gifts. (Some suggestions below). To help the distribution process, please put a note on the bag showing age/boy or girl/or if you concentrated on one specific toy or clothing item. Suggestions from the Police Department this year included warm clothing/lap blankets/pajamas/gloves/etc. that could be included with a toy if possible. Also, most often overlooked are the older teens.

Do not wrap gifts; mark bag with age/boy or girl information

Smaller gifts are usually better as most children receive 2-5 gifts

Collection Day-Sunday, December 13<sup>th</sup> (time/place of collection to be determined closer to Dec 13<sup>th</sup>.)


### **BOOK CLUB**

## Neuman, David D.


### 12/8/1940 - 10/16/2020



David D. Neuman passed away on October 16, 2020 after a 16 year-long battle with cancer. He was born in Bucyrus, OH to H. Dale Neumann and Martha E. Withee. His family moved to La Porte, IN when he was around the age of 9. He attended school in La Porte and graduated from La Porte High School in 1959. After high school he completed a course in barbering at Moler Barber College in Chicago. Knowing he would soon be called into service, he joined the Navy in 1963 and served 3 years active-duty followed by 20 years service in the Navy Reserves. On September 18, 1965 Dave married Joanne L. Ohlis from La Porte, IN. and they spent one year living in San Diego, CA. Shortly after returning to La Porte he began working at Gary Post Tribune which was the start to his career in newspapers. Dave and Joanne added their son, Jeffrey D. Neuman, to their family in 1971 and, in 1973, they moved their family to Thornton, CO where he would spend the rest of his life. Dave found work with the Rocky Mountain News and spent 28 1/2 years working as a printer. Their daughter, Wendy J. Neuman was added to the family in 1976.

Over the years, he was deeply

involved in the Denver Typographical Union and the American Legion Post 22 in Northglenn, CO. He would serve in different positions in both organizations and continued to visit the American Legion whenever possible until he was no longer mobile enough to do so. He loved the beautiful Rocky Mountains of his adopted state and rode many miles through them on his road bike to support different charities. Dave will be missed by his wife Joanne Neuman; son Jeff (Dianne) Neuman; grandchildren Jacob, David, James, and Christina Neuman; Daughter Wendy (Steve) Neuman-Kelsey; numerous furry and feathered grand-pets; brother Phil (Diane) Neumann and many friends. He was preceded in death by his parents, Dale and Martha Neuman, and his sister, Mary Lou Reed.
